LEVEL TWO

GET READY:

- ✓ Some yummy treats
- ✓ 1-3+ human helpers
- ✓ Leash (If in a space with no boundaries)
- ✓ Find an open space the dog is familiar and comfortable with, that is as free of distractions as possible (Backyard, living room, kitchen, dining room, bedroom, garage, etc.).

GET SET:

- ✓ Make sure each helper has some tasty treats ready and easy to access (i.e. treat bag, pocket, etc.)
- ✓ Leash on and dragging (If applicable)
- ✓ Have yourself and your helpers positioned in a circle around your dog

GO:

- ✓ The goal of this level is to build value for your dog's name, no matter who calls them.
- ✓ To do this, have your helpers take turns calling your dog to them in a random order.
 - If your dog goes to who called them, have that helper grab their collar and reward them. Then have another person call them.
 - Ex: "Rover!" – dog comes to person – collar grab - treat
 - If your dog does not go to who called them, **DO NOT REPEAT THE DOG'S NAME!!** Have the person clap, make kissing noises or call "puppy!" to get the dog's attention. If this doesn't work, move on to another person.
 - Repeat this process every time the dog doesn't respond.
 - If your dog does not respond 3 times in a row, stop the exercise.
 - This means that either your dog is not ready for this level of stimulation or their name doesn't hold enough value yet.
 - Therefore, you need to either:
 - Practice the name game and Come Level 1 some more



OR

- **Find a location that is less stimulating, use higher value treats, have fewer helpers, or maybe use helpers the dog is more familiar with and more willing to visit**
- ✓ **Practice calling your dog's name until your dog comes on the first call 5 times in a row. Then move on to Level 3.**
